Milton's Sharpshooters lived up to their nickname Friday night at Civic hall as they fired in goals at a .490 clip to dispose of Centerville's Bulldogs, 65-55, in the second game on the sectional program.

Richmond's Red Devils had set an equally hot pace in the first game in turning back Williamsburg's neverquit Yellow Jackets, 74-58. The sectional hosts managed goals at a .492 rate in the opener.

Milton and Richmond thus joined Fountain City and Cambridge City in the semifinals of the 1960 sectional which will wind up Saturday. Fountain City and Cambridge City will collide at 1 p. m. Saturday, with Milton testing

Richmond at 2:15 o'clock. The afternoon winners will meet for the sectional title at 8:15 p. m.

Fountain City and Cambridge City had easier paths to the semifinals than did either Richmond or Milton. The Little Giants disposed of Webster, 74-46, after Cambridge downed Whitewater, 71-53, in the afternoon opener.

Zone Pays Off

A tight Milton zone paid dividends for Coach Jim Howeil's Sharpshooters as it stopped Centerville's Daryl Renschler, one of the top scorers in the county, almost cold. Renschler collected five points the last period and ended with 10 for the night, while center Fred Roehler missed the scoring column altogether.

Sparked by the excellent floor work of Jerry Bohlander and the outstanding rebounding of Dave Parker, Milton quickly moved from a13-all first-period deadlock with the Bulldogs to a 30-26 half-time lead.

Four points was as close as Centerville was to come in the second half as the Sharpshooters put eight goals through the hoop in 13 tries in the third quarter. Parker and Bohlander accounted for three each.

Down 47-32 going into the final period, Centerville began to press the Sharpshooters and it began to payoff. The Sharpies committed 12 errors in the final stanza, but netted 12 of 13 free throws as Centerville made eight personals in a frenzied attempt to get the ball.

Twice in the closing minutes of the struggle, Centerville sliced Milton's margin to seven points, but

each time the Sharpies came back with a brace of charity shots.

Bohlander made seven-ofseven tries from the 15 foot stripe as he dribbled away time in the final period.

The Bulldogs' Bud Wetzel sent them into a 2-0 start with the first of five long shots, but that was to be their only lead of the night. The game was tied at 7, 9 and 13 (at the first rest) before Stan Jenkins sent the Sharpshooters in front at 15-13 with a push shot from the side.

Bohlander started working on the bulk of his night's total of 30 in the second stanza as he tallied eight points. Parker added five and the Sharpies led, 30-26, at the half.

Biggest Lead

Milton's biggest lead of the night was at; 49-32 before the Centerville press started having its effect. The fast-closing Bulldogs narrowed it to seven at 55-48 and 57-50 in the final three minutes, but then the Sharpies went into a "freeze" and held on to the ball except when they shot free throws.

Milton hit 24 of 49 from the field, including 11 of 17 the second half. Most were, from long range. Centerville was above average at .371 on 23 of 62.

Centerville had a slight edge on the boards, 31-29, with Renschler's nine setting the pace. Parker collected 18 rebounds for Milton.

Trailing Bohlander's 30 points was Parker with 19. Kinder hit 14 points for Centerville, with Renschler, Wetzel and Bob Soper adding 10 each.

Richmond used superior height and better shooting to down Williamsburg in the opening game before a capacity crowd.

The Yellow Jackets, who had eliminated defendingchampion Hagerstown with a great rally in their first start, had a poor start again Friday night.

Bounce Back

Down 16-4 at the first quarter, Williamsburg bounced back to outscore Richmond in the second stanza and play the Red Devils almost even the third and fourth quarters.

Richmond, plagued by passing errors, held only a 32-22 lead at the half as Ralph Barker, Bobby Hall and J. B. Cain turned in their usual good performances.

But the Red Devils, led by Larry Hitchcock, Dave Greene and Larry Satterfield, weren't to be denied this sectional victory and moved to a 54-39 lead after three quarters over the scrappy Yellow Jackets.

Barker came up with 10 points in the final period, but was the only Jacket to manage more than four points.

Richmond made good on 29 of 59 tries from the field; including 17 of 30 the second half for a .492 mark, while Williamsburg, getting only one shot at a time, hit on 15 of 52 tries, a .288 average.

Add 28 Points

The Yellow Jackets made almost as many points at the free throw line as from the field as they hit. on 28 of 35 tries.

Barker made 11 of 13 attempts from the charity stripe and ended with 23 points. All but six came in the second half as he began to shake his closely-guarding defenders.


Hitchcock led Richmond with 24 points, with Greene and Larry Satterfield adding 15 each. Cain managed 10 to go with Barker's 23 to spark Williamsburg.

Richmond picked off 48 rebounds to 15 for Williamsburg, with Greene, a former classmate of many of the Williamsburg players, getting 13. Sophomore Sonny sage grabbed 10.
