Certainly it is a mark for the Cats (Varsity) to shoot at. The Kittens' record for the season was 5-0-2. The two ties were with Brookville and Hagerstown.

Felton, in his first year as assistant to head coach Buzz Duff of the Cats performed a double roll. That of tutoring the JV's thru a most successful seven game card.

When informed his Kittens had made grid history, the modest, likeable Felton said, "They're a fine group - they improved with each game and had a lot of desire."

It is agreed there are some promising Varsity timber for the coming seasons.

In the scoring records listed below it must be noted that Dick Craig was promoted to full time Varsity status after the Kittens' first game.

In the defensive department - the tackling laurels went to Steve Derrick with 41.
